 - Location Coordinates (GPS)
 - o Photographic Evidence
 - Brief Description (Ecological Significance, Local Importance)

5. Evaluation Criteria

Entries will be evaluated based on:

- Accuracy of identification
- Quality of documentation
- Number of species correctly identified.

- Impact on biodiversity conservation.
- Content of Brief Description.
- Number of Wetland/ Biodiversity Hotspots documented.
- The evaluation committee may identify more Criteria at the time of evaluation.

6. Prizes

The winners will receive cash prizes sponsored by the Tripura Biodiversity Board.
